D-Day Museum Expansion

Dr. Mueller will share his experiences as a life-time educator, his personal friendship with the internationally recognized historian, the late Stephen Ambrose, and his education-related career change to head up The National D-Day Museum Foundation, Inc. He will bring the audience up to date on the planned expansion of the D-Day Museum and the opportunities the Museum affords teachers, parents, and all citizens in the metropolitan New Orleans area.

Dr. Gordon “Nick” Mueller is President and CEO of The National D-Day Museum Foundation, Inc. Previously, he served as Chairman of the Board of Directors of The National D-Day Museum, leading the organization since 1998 through its final fundraising and construction phases to the Grand Opening on June 6, 2000. His recent appointment to the full-time position of President and CEO allowed him to continue to guide the institution beyond its first years of operation and the opening of the Pacific Exhibit on December 7, 2001, into a major expansion on adjacent properties. Earlier this year, he retired from the University of New Orleans where he enjoyed a 33-year career as Professor of European Diplomatic History, Dean, Vice Chancellor of Extension, and



President of the UNO Research and Technology Park.

Dr. Mueller also served in national leadership positions in the State University Land Grant Association and the National University Continuing Education Association. His local community involvement includes the Chamber of Commerce, the Downtown Development District, the International Business Committee and the World Trade Center New Orleans, and as Founder and Executive Director of UNO’s Business – Higher Education Council.

Dr. Mueller earned his Bachelor’s degree at Stetson University, an M.A. and Ph.D. at the University of North Carolina, and has done post-graduate work at Yale, Harvard and several European Universities.

He and his wife, Beth, have two sons, David and John.

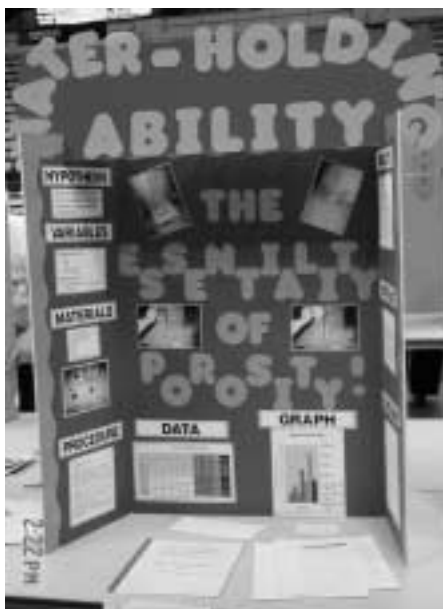

Though exhibits were not submitted under this category, API judges chose winners from over 20 exhibits whose subject matter pertained to the energy industry. Our goal, through our generous awards and recognition of teachers and schools, is to help establish a strong petroleum science category in 2006. This year's awards and recipients include:

Chairman's Award - Betsy Lopez received \$150 for her exhibit entitled "Determination of the Ability to Use Pontederia as Biomarkers for Monitoring Trace Heavy Metals in Jefferson Parish Drainage Canals Using Acid". Ms. Lopez is a junior at East Jefferson High School, Jefferson Parish Public Schools, and also won 1st place in the category of environmental science. API-Delta awarded East Jefferson \$300 as well as her teacher, Cheryl Offner \$150. She won 1st place in the category of environmental science and will be going to the Intel International Science and Engineering Fair this year.

The Distinguished Project was awarded to **Thien Nguyen** for his

project "The Effect of Tower Designs on the Structural Efficiency". Mr. Nguyen, a freshman at John Ehret High School, received \$100 and his high school, a Jefferson Public School, received \$200. His teacher, Velinda Verdin, will receive \$100.

The API-Delta's **Honorable Mention** award went to **Rachel Charbonnet-Baker** for her exhibit "The Permeability and Porosity of Different Soil Textures." Rachel received \$50, her school, Ben Franklin High School, will receive \$100 and her teacher, LaWana Stewart will receive \$50.

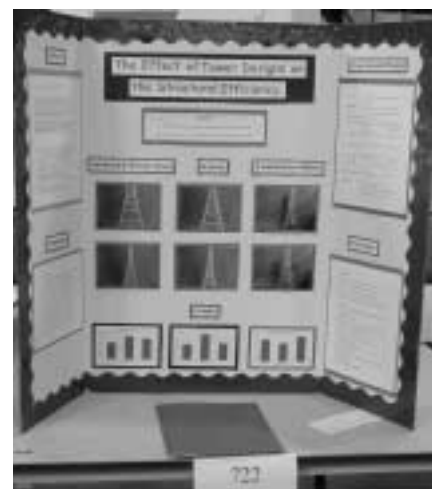


Ben Franklin is an Orleans Parish Public school. Ms. Charbonnet-Baker is a junior and also won 3rd place in the earth science category.

API Statement on House Energy Bill Actions

American Petroleum Institute President and CEO Red Cavaney issued the following statement today regarding action by three House committees that next sends a comprehensive energy bill to the House floor for action:

“This is a welcome development for energy consumers and the nation as well as for the oil and natural gas industry, which is committed to providing its customers with ample, reliable and affordable energy supplies.

“We are encouraged the House Energy and Commerce, Ways and Means and Resources Committees have moved forward on a comprehensive, balanced energy proposal

that will now be considered by the full House. We hope the Senate will soon act as well. A comprehensive energy bill is long overdue and sorely needed to strengthen our nation’s energy future.

2005 International Oil Spill Conference to Highlight Technology

Oil spills caused by hurricanes in the Gulf of Mexico and a spill from the Greek tanker Athos I in the Delaware River are among the topics to be discussed during the 19th International Oil Spill Conference to be held at the Miami Beach Convention Center May 15-19. The official theme for the IOSC is "Prevention, Preparedness, Response and Restoration—Raising Global Standards."

A full agenda on oil spill techniques and prevention technologies will be among the highlights for more than 2,000 people from 50 countries expected to attend the conference.

FYI on Gasoline Prices


TODAY, a barrel of crude oil (NYMEX) sells for about \$54. This is about \$19 per barrel (46 cents per gallon) more than at the start of this year. Over the same period, the average per gallon price of gasoline has increased by 49 cents to an average of \$2.32.

API Monthly Statistical Report for March 2005

Petroleum product deliveries, a key measure of demand, rose 2.5 percent for the first quarter of this year, even in the face of sharply rising world crude oil prices which were reflected in refined product prices, according to the API Monthly Statistical Report for March.

2003 Drilling Costs

The U.S. oil and natural gas industry spent more on drilling in 2003 than in the previous year according to the 2003 Joint Association Survey on Drilling Costs released today by the American Petroleum Institute. The only time U.S. operators have exceeded 2003's drilling and completion cost figure was in 1982, survey results show. Survey participants include API, the Independent Petroleum Association of America and the Mid-Continent Oil & Gas Association.
